The importance of the fashion industry's effect on sustainability was recognized this year at the G7 Summit, at which French president Emmanuel Macron introduced the Fashion Pact.

The Pact is a set of shared objectives the fashion industry can work toward. In a historic move, a coalition of 32 leading companies from the fashion and textile industry have developed a set of shared objectives intended to reduce their industry's environmental impact.
